

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN

2022

We are thrilled to share about Living Room's expanded services that will allow for a greater reach in our community! Our vision has always been to honor life and offer hope, and we are amazed by all of the practical ways we get to live this out each day.

MOTHER AND BABY UNIT

Constructed and opened a Mother and Baby Unit at Living Room Hospital in Eldoret. The unit includes a labor and delivery room, operating suite for emergency c-sections, newborn nursery, and recovery room. In Kenya, maternal mortality is a leading cause of death among women of child-bearing age, and one in every 26 infants dies before their first birthday. Living Room is committed to being part of changing these statistics. Our Mother and Baby Unit officially launched its services in May.

MICAH'S HOUSE

Construction is underway at Living Room Hospital in Eldoret of a 64-bed family care center for children and families who have traveled far distances to undergo cancer treatment at a nearby government hospital. Named after Micah 6:8 that says, "God has shown us what is good and what is required. We are to do justly, to love mercy, and walk humbly with God." Living Room will provide free housing, accommodation and transportation. Our hope is that our hospitality and love will make room for healing to be possible. The program is currently providing care within our existing space but expected to open in September.







PEDIATRIC SERVICES

Living Room Hospital in Eldoret is increasing its programs and specialty services for children in the community and hospital. We have a team of pediatricians committed to the physical, emotional, and spiritual needs of children. We want to be part of preventing disease, promoting wellness and treating sickness.

MAKING EDUCATION ACCESSIBLE FOR ALL

Living Room's Kimbilio Hospice in Kipkaren partnered with Brook of Faith Academy to create a barrier-free, wheelchair-accessible school for children with physical disabilities. This dream started through our 12-year-old guest, Brighton, whose spinal cord injury left him paralyzed from the waist down. When he was ready to be discharged from Kimbilio, Brighton's desire to receive a quality education moved us to action. We pray this will open the door for others, like Brighton, to also access their right to an education.

OPERATING ROOM & INTENSIVE CARE UNIT

Living Room Hospital in Eldoret is constructing two surgical suites and an intensive care unit. Construction is expected to be completed in September.



Tumaini na Afya

(Hope & Health)

Ruth's radiant smile is a result of a gift she recently received from Living Room – a new prosthetic leg. Ruth has no memory of the accident that occurred when she was only nine-months old. The story was told that she was crawling on the dirt floor of the mud-walled, grass-thatched kitchen where her mother used to use the traditional three stones and firewood to cook. Ruth's leg entered the fire without her deaf mother hearing her screams. An aunt heard and rushed to save her. Ruth's entire leg was badly burned; and though treated, it became contracted and never healed properly. At the age of 12, Ruth's leg was amputated; two years later, she received a prosthetic leg – one of her best childhood memories.

Living Room's Tumaini na Afya (Hope & Health) outreach team met Ruth in 2020 through a neighbor who encouraged her to come to Kimbilio Hospice for physical therapy services. At the time, Ruth was in great pain. She had been using that same prosthetic leg for 23 years. With great love and care, our team found a way to get Ruth a new leg that fit her properly. When asked: "How has Living Room impacted your life?" she quickly responds:

"I can now walk without pain.
Asante kabisa! Thank you very much!"







Meet Florence

AN INTERVIEW WITH LIVING ROOM'S PROGRAM
COORDINATOR IN SOCIAL SERVICES

Describe your role at Living Room Eldoret...

I am a Social Worker at Living Room Hospital in Eldoret. I have been a part of the Living Room team for 10 years, originally at Kimbilio Hospice and now in Eldoret since 2019. I am the Program Coordinator for our accommodation services for children and parents who have traveled far distances for their cancer treatment and need a place to stay. I, along with my team, ensure the children are well taken care of. Right now, we have capacity for 15 children plus a parent in the hospital, but we look forward to the new building that is currently being constructed that will allow for us to care for even more children and families.

What impact do you see on patients and their families who come to Living Room for accommodation?

Since we started providing accommodation services for children at Living Room, we have welcomed kids from all over the country of Kenya. Parents and children have been able to be cared for with food and a safe, clean bed to sleep in, relieving the heavy burden of finding and affording a place to stay while their child is undergoing outpatient radiation therapy or chemotherapy.

One father, after his son completed 33 sessions of radiation therapy, said to me: "Thank you for taking us in, I have seen God. I wish all hospitals were like Living Room."

I am grateful for the play therapy and holistic care our team provides that allows the children to be more than a patient.

What keeps you motivated and inspired to do your job?

I am motivated by how happy the children and their parents/guardians are after having stayed in a good, loving and comfortable environment. The little miracles we see every day at Living Room reminds me that God is still at work, working through us. As a parent, I know the value of a child's smile. The peace parents have when their children get to stay at Living Room for accommodation is always a sigh of relief. I am always grateful to God for the provisions. I am honored to be able to walk the journey of treatment with the guests and their families, reassuring them through our presence and support.

Where do you see Living Room Hospital in 5 years?

In the next 5 years, Living Room Hospital will have touched so many lives. We will have stories from the whole of Kenya of children who survived their illness, in part because of the love and support we were able to provide. I envision that Living Room Hospital will be a center specializing in Child Life Services, both in the care we give to children but also training others. We will have shared the love of Christ through our actions with so many children and their families.

I was deeply affected by one of our home visits on the first day of outreach. We visited an adolescent male, who was a paraplegic and had an ostomy and a ventriculoperitoneal shunt. I was stunned to see that his mother had been reusing the same ostomy bag for who knows how long. The bag itself was broken, and she stated she had had a very difficult time getting any more bags. I could tell she was taking good care of her son and doing the very best with what she had. It was a deep learning experience for me. I was so used to having resources at the ready in the US and this is not always the case in Kenya. It certainly wasn't for this particular family. We were able to do ostomy care and change out the bag for this adolescent boy and were also able to supply the mother with several more bags. She was overjoyed! This experience really made me think about resources and waste and how many things are taken for granted in Western culture. This situation prompted me to think more deeply about stewardship of resources...a little can go a long way. And God can do much with our generosity."
